Note: The E2020 courses listed above fulfill the district's diploma requirement. These courses have not been certified as fulfilling the "a-g" subject requirement for admission to the California University system as a freshman.

Additional courses will be added upon approval by the Oakdale Unified School District. Students who desire to take an on-line course to make-up a failed grade, improve a grade or accommodate an impacted schedule, must receive approval from their school counselor prior to taking the on-line course. As a part of the approval process the school counselor will review the following:

- The course requested to be taken is for make-up, grade improvement or to accommodate an impacted schedule and meets the pre-approved criteria.
- It is the first priority of the school district to accommodate students within the regular school day. As a part of the district's on-line approval process, each student's traditional school day schedule will be reviewed. An on-line course may not be taken if it is determined by a school counselor that there is room in the student's schedule to take the course in a traditional school day class.
- No more than a total of 5 credits are received during a school semester through co-enrollment courses.
- In addition, a total of 10 credits may also be earned during the summer through summer courses.

To receive school counselor approval, students must complete the On-line Course Application and submit to the school counselor. The school counselor will then schedule an appointment to review the request. School counselor approval must be obtained prior to starting the on-line course.
