Staff Development Continues at Sites

*Review 2008-2011 Strategic Plan and
Operational Plan*

The OJUSD Board of Trustees requested district and community input to develop a new strategic plan for 2008-2011. Over the next 3-5 years, the district will develop action plans to carry out these goals and objectives.

The Strategic Plan positions the district to focus its resources toward ensuring those core values guiding the continuing improvement of educational services through the collaborative efforts of the Board of Trustees, school district administration, all school district teachers and personnel, parents, students, and the communities the school serves.



Keric Ashley comes from a family of educators. His father was an assistant superintendent for many years. Other family members include a current assistant superintendent, a principal and two teachers.

His education started early at home, learning life's lessons from 6 siblings. He taught elementary and middle school students for 8 years and was a school site administrator for another 7 years. During these 15 years, he worked at all three levels - elementary, middle and high school.

Keric Ashley continued his career working for the California Department of Education (CDE). For the last 15 years, he has mastered the multi-syllabic acronyms required of all good state workers and has slogged through the bureaucracy related to compliance reviews, K-3 Class Size Reduction and, most recently, the world of data. As Director of the Data Management Division, his staff is responsible for some major data collections for the CDE, including CBEDS, Language Census, Consolidated Application, and developing the systems in process to collect student and teacher data (CALPADS and CALTIDES). He is currently working on a video production titled, "Data Geeks Gone Wild" that explores the murky, yet wacky underworld of data techs and their propensity for pocket protectors and illicit cyberware.

As a father of three boys still in school, he will be sharing his experiences and insights into California education from the perspective of parent, teacher, principal and state educator.
